



## Packing list winter

When packing for Outward Bound it is good to remember that you will be living an active lifestyle. Focus on function, not fashion! In general you should be packing clothes that breath well and keep you warm. Layering is essential: it is better to wear a few lighter layers instead of one thick layer. Please note that cotton is not a good insulating layer in winter!

If you think of your clothing in terms of day clothes and night time clothes it will help minimize the amount you need to pack. For example, what will you wear during the day to stay warm and active? What will you want to put on at night to stay comfy and warm? The top layers stay the same, while you may want to bring fresh base layers to change.

| ▪ Drinking bottle (no glass, 2x500ml or 1L) (high-quality Nalgene bottle can be bought for 10 €) |  |
| ▪ Lunchbox (can be bought for 3 €)   |  |
| ▪ Backpack* (40-50L)   |  |
| ▪ Headlight / flashlight (could be shared)   |  |
| ▪ Music instruments (optional for base camp)   |  |
| ▪ Photocopy of international insurance card and passport   |  |
| ▪ Inform and deliver school nurse necessary medication   |  |
| ▪ Table tennis racket (optional)   |  |
